### Rector Food Pantry

On March 27, a member of our outreach team volunteered with the Arkansas Minority Health Commission to provide wellness checks for community members at the Rector Food Pantry in Northeast Arkansas. These wellness checks included glucose monitoring, blood pressure checks, and cholesterol screenings. The Rector Food Pantry is a food assistance resource for community members in the Rector School District. It is one of 20 distribution sites partnering with the Food Bank of Northeast Arkansas, which provides food for community members across 11 counties. Arkansas Minority Health Commission was onsite during one of their commodity distribution days to provide health screenings and education to the public.

## Special Olympics

### Team Volunteering

Special Olympics Arkansas kicked off their Summer Games on May 23 at Harding University. Their mission is to provide year-round sports training and competitions for children and adults with intellectual disabilities, helping them improve fitness, show courage, experience joy, and build friendships within their community. At the Special Olympics, athletes compete in powerlifting, tennis, bocce, flag football, swimming, and track. Eight members of our Care Coordination team volunteered to help with event logistics and had the opportunity to cheer on the athletes.



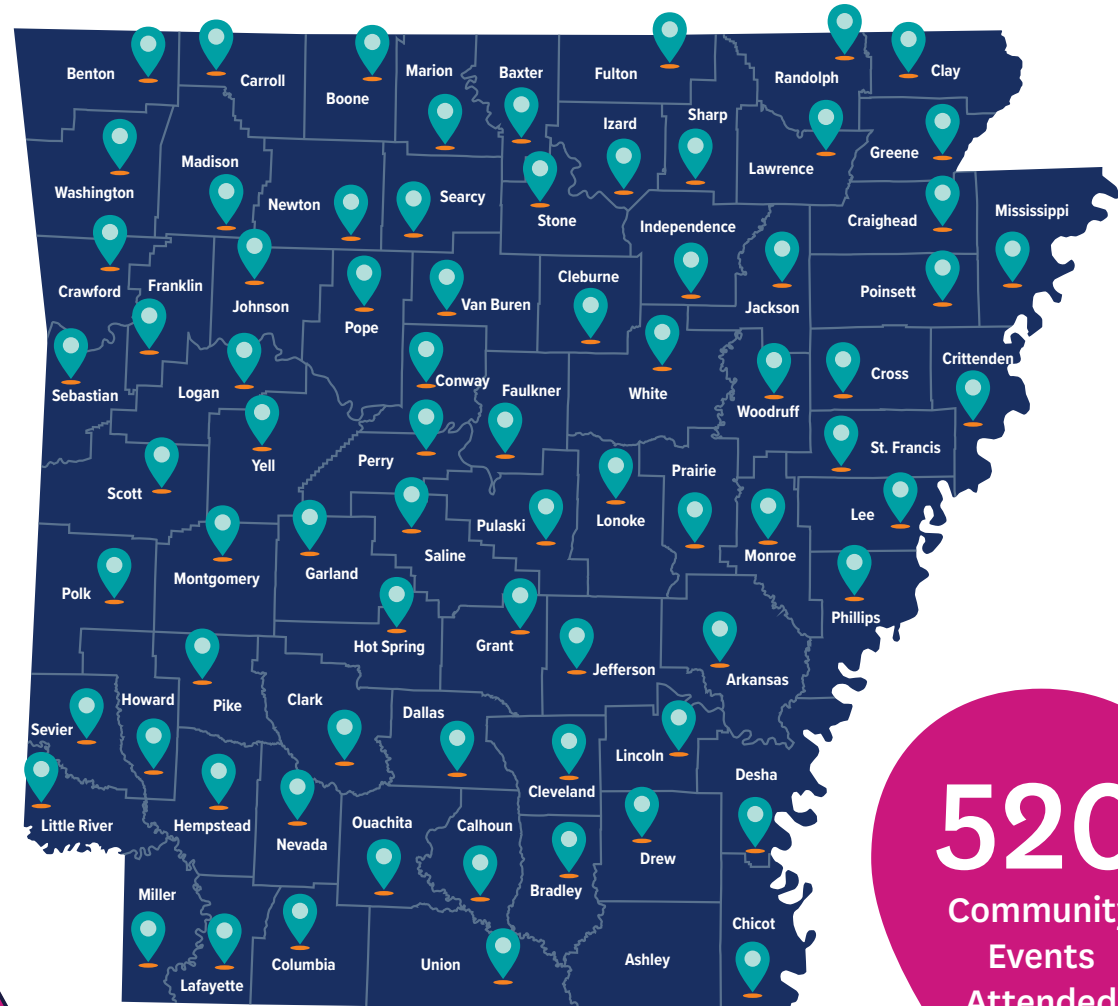

## Health Plan Outreach Events

In addition to partnering with local organizations to help make their events successful, our health plan also organizes and executes events throughout the year to provide resources and education for the community. In 2024, we hosted three baby showers for new and expecting members. We also organized and promoted four health fairs open to all members of the community. These outreach events give members the opportunity to gain valuable community resources, informational materials, health screenings, and giveaways.

## Baby Showers

The Outreach team hosted one in-person and two virtual events where community partners shared information about what to expect during various steps of the prenatal and postpartum journey, including labor and delivery, breastfeeding, infant and maternal nutrition, and growth and development. Each member received an attendee gift and had the opportunity to win one of several car seats and pack-n-plays to encourage engagement during our shower games segment. During our virtual baby showers, pregnant members attended from several counties across the state.

### Spring Virtual Baby Shower

The Spring Virtual Baby Shower took place on April 20. We had 17 attendees join from around the state of Arkansas. In addition to providing information and resources to expecting members, we gave away three pack-n-plays, three car seats, and a variety of baby gifts and supplies.

### Little Rock Baby Shower

Our second baby shower was held on June 8. We hosted 20 attendees from eight counties in Arkansas. We provided information and resources to expecting members and gifted three pack-n-plays, three car seats, one booster seat, and a variety of baby gifts and supplies.

### Fall Virtual Baby Shower

Our Fall Virtual Baby Shower took place on November 16. Nineteen members joined from around the state. In addition to providing information and resources to expecting members, we gave away two pack-n-plays and three car seats. Each attendee received gift bags that included an assortment of care items.



# Health Fairs

Our health fairs are free to attend and open to the community. Ambetter and Arkansas Total Care members residing in the area where the event is hosted receive email invitations, and our Communications team leverages social media to promote the event. These events are designed to close gaps in care and reduce negative impacts of social determinants of health (SDoH) by offering a variety of screenings and local connections to providers and subject matter experts. Below are some of the community partners and services that were available as resources:



**Arkansas Health Plan Quality Team** — Our health plan Quality team was on site to provide educational resources and talk with members about general health and chronic conditions, diabetes management, women’s health, the importance of annual wellness visits, what to expect during pregnancy, and the importance of well child visits and immunizations.

**University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences (UAMS) Community Health & Research** — Clinicians from UAMS provided health screenings for high blood pressure, A1C, and BMI. Covid-19 and flu vaccines were also available. Attendees with screening results that indicated high blood pressure were provided an Ambetter Blood Pressure Care Kit donated by the Ambetter Health Community Relations team. Of those screened, 16 were given blood pressure kits.

**ARORA (Arkansas Regional Organ Recovery Agency)** — Volunteers spoke with attendees about the importance of organ and tissue donation and how to register to be an organ donor.

**Welcome Health** — One of Northwest Arkansas’ free health centers offered oral health screenings and information about clinic services.

**Arisa Health** — Volunteers from this integrated behavioral health system provided information about mental health services available through Arisa, including therapeutic foster care.

**Well Fed Arkansas** — Well Fed’s mobile market was on site to provide guests with fresh fruits, vegetables, and grains.

**Sara Sullivan** — A massage therapist provided chair massages for health fair participants.

**Deep Roots Chiropractic Health Center** — Clinicians provided free surface EMG scans to assess muscle function and gave attendees information on how to maintain a healthy spine and nervous system.

**Paint by Faces** — Provided face painting to attendees.

**Arkansas Department of Health** — Volunteers equipped attendees with information on tuberculosis, including how it spreads and what to do if infected. They also reviewed immunizations and services available to the community through the Department of Health.

**Westrock Orthodontics** — Staff was on site to provide complimentary orthodontic consultation.

**First Connections Early Intervention Program** —

Representatives were available to speak with families of infants and toddlers with developmental delays or disabilities. The program provides developmental assessments, early intervention services, and therapies to help children reach developmental milestones.

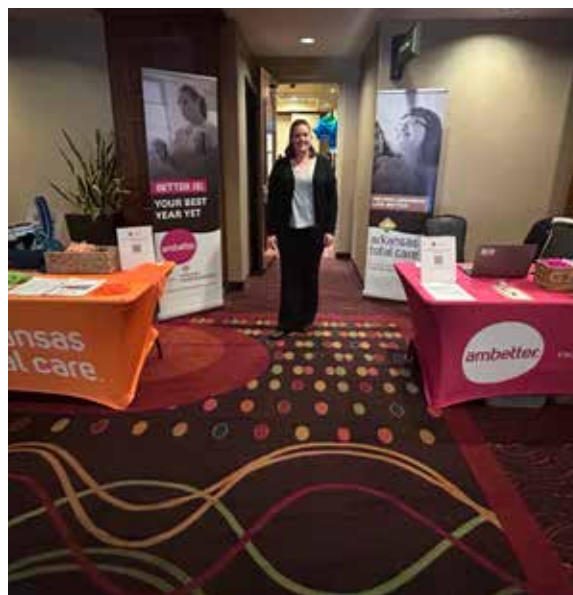
**Family Network** — Volunteers provided information about Family Network programs and resources, including home visits and parenting support.

## Arkansas Minority Health



**Working today for  
a healthier tomorrow.**

Arkansas Minority Health Commission (AMHC) is dedicated to addressing health disparities among minority populations in Arkansas. It aims to improve health outcomes through advocacy, education, and collaboration throughout Arkansas.

AMHC's Mobile Health Unit (MHU) is a screening center on wheels. The MHU provides an avenue to double AMHC's preventive screenings by reaching people where they are in the state. The MHU provides preventive screenings, health education, and an opportunity to coordinate patient care with the MHU coordinator. Screenings include blood pressure, cholesterol, blood sugar/glucose, A1C, HIV, height, weight, BMI, colon cancer, and more! The MHU coordinator follows up with participants who have abnormal results and shares local resources for follow-up care. The MHU partners with Arkansas Foodbank statewide.





## Mommy and Me Event by Harbor House



In March, the Ambetter Outreach team partnered with Harbor House for their Mommy and Me Event. This event provided supplies, resources, and education to new mothers, parents, and guardians. There were games and events for children and families who attended.

## True Harvest Missionary Baptist Church Community Health Fair

On April 13, one of our Outreach Representatives attended the True Harvest MBC's Community Health Fair in Dumas. Organized by members of the True Harvest MBC, community partners gathered to support the residents of Dumas and the surrounding area. The Arkansas Minority Health Commission was on site event to provide screenings and health education to attendees.



## Comprehensive Prevention Conference

Ambetter sponsored and hosted a booth at the Arkansas HIV Planning Group's Comprehensive Prevention Conference, where we spoke with attendees about our plan offerings. We worked alongside providers, nonprofit organizations, care coordinators, and other entities committed to this cause.

The Arkansas HIV Planning Group is tasked with building community strategies to create a prevention plan for the state. The Arkansas HIV Planning Group is composed of several organizations dedicated to the work of equitable prevention to end multiple epidemics like HIV, STDs, and HCV. The spectrum of more than 150 members come from the Arkansas Department of Health, Federally Qualified Health Centers, community-based organizations, Ryan White organizations, and other Arkansas groups dedicated to HIV prevention, care, and treatment.



## Texarkana Autism Inclusion Expo



The Texarkana Parks and Recreation Department hosted the Autism Inclusion Expo on January 27 to help families learn more about autism and resources available for families. The Expo provided education, training,

and support to families who have children with autism or are unsure if their child is on the spectrum. The Outreach team from Arkansas Total Care participated, providing education, training, and support to attendees.

## Salvation Army Food Pantry

The Salvation Army of Pine Bluff's food pantry program addresses the needs of low-income individuals and households that lack reliable access to affordable, nutritious food and may experience hunger on a regular basis. Our team visits the food pantry twice a month to help distribute resources.



## Conway County Care Center Food Bank



Conway County Care Center supports the community through their food bank. The storefront serves as a resale shop to raise funds, while the food pantry is housed in the back of the building. This resource is available to anyone in need of food — no questions asked. Teams from Ambetter were on hand to support the community and distribute food on April 19.

## Cricket Wireless Events

We partner with Cricket Wireless because of their commitment to support the community. Wireless service is an essential utility when it comes to functioning easily in our society. Our partnership with Cricket Wireless allows Ambetter members to use My Health Pays® rewards points to pay their wireless bills. The Youth Advisory Board (YAB), composed of current foster care youth representing their peers, organized the conference. The conference's objectives are to prepare youth for life after foster care, teach essential life skills, and provide information on post-secondary career and educational opportunities. Several members of Arkansas Total Care staff attended and assisted with logistics.



## Game and Fish Family Fun Day

The Arkansas Game and Fish Commission's Family Fun Day returned to the Arkansas State University pond on Saturday, May 18. The event featured a fishing derby, archery, and free food. Ambetter from Arkansas Health & Wellness sponsored the event.



## Kiss the Bride Expo



The outreach team was on site at the Kiss the Bride Expo in Springdale to meet and talk to attendees. Marriage is a qualifying life event, which makes participants eligible for a special enrollment period. If a person is uninsured

or underinsured at the time of their marriage, they are eligible to enroll in or make changes to their coverage. Our team was on site to answer questions about this process and provide information.

## College & Career Ready Transition Fair

On March 27, our Outreach team participated in the College and Career Ready Transition Fair, organized by the Division of Services for the Blind. This event offered essential resources to blind and visually impaired students to help them successfully navigate life. The Division of Services for the Blind works to improve the personal and economic independence of blind and severely visually impaired individuals of all ages in Arkansas.



## Philander Smith University Spring Health Fair

The Ambetter Outreach team hosted a booth at the Philander Smith University Health Fair on February 14. The health fair brought together a variety of vendor partners to speak with students, employees, and the surrounding community about important aspects of wellness and living a healthy lifestyle. This event was an opportunity to share educational information and provide valuable health and wellness resources through giveaways, health screenings, handouts, and interactive activities.



## Hogskin Holidays Health Fair in Hampton



The 32nd Annual Hogskin Holidays Health Fair took place on April 12 at the Calhoun County Courthouse Square in Hampton. The annual health fair provides the opportunity to inform residents and visitors of Calhoun County of the many services and resources available to them.

## Back to School Backpack Drive

On June 7, we took part in a meaningful initiative at the F.E.E.D. headquarters. Our team contributed by collecting donations of school supplies, which were later distributed to local schools in August, helping students start the academic year equipped and empowered.





## Philander Smith University Fall Health Fair

The Arkansas Health & Wellness Outreach team attended the Philander Smith University Health Fair on October 8. This fair did double-duty as both a health fair and healthcare career expo, providing resources for students, employees, and the community. In addition to health and wellness information, the expo provided information about careers in the healthcare industry as well as employment and internship opportunities.



## Cassandra Cares Cancer Foundation Health Fair

The Cassandra Cares Cancer Foundation hosted a health fair in Health Fair in Crossett. The Foundation's goal is to raise awareness about colorectal cancer and reduce disparities in detection, treatment, and support in Arkansas' underserved communities.

Teams from Ambetter provided free health education, screenings, snacks, and games.

## Workshops Hosted by Alzheimer's Arkansas

In 2024, our Care Coordinators attended two AlzARK Caregiver Workshops by Alzheimer Arkansas. These workshops provide family members and professional caregivers essential information about Alzheimer's and other types of dementia. The workshops educate about disease progression, caregiving tools, techniques, and self-care tips. Attendees also receive details about resources available to caregivers and those living with dementia through vendor exhibits. These workshops are made possible with the support of local community partners.



## | Unsheltered Event

An event hosted by the Little Rock Department of Housing and Neighborhood Programs hosted an “Unsheltered Event” to provide direct assistance to the unhoused community in and around Central Arkansas.

Nonprofits and organizations from around the city came out to meet with people experiencing homelessness, and to connect them with available resources like housing, food assistance, medical services, employment resources, and other necessities such as toiletries and transportation.



## | Unsheltered Resource Fair



In September, October, and November, a series of Unsheltered Outreach Fairs were held in North Little Rock. These events were a place to share resources with the unsheltered community and improve the quality of life for citizens needing assistance. Numerous community organizations, including Ambetter, stepped up to contribute to these events. The event featured free physical and mental health screenings, a mobile shower unit, hygiene items, shaves and haircuts, and assistance applying for an Arkansas identification card. The mobile Arkansas Workforce Center was also on site to help attendees identify and apply for job opportunities.

## The Stewpot

On Wednesday, March 13, health plan leaders volunteered at the Stewpot, cooking and serving lunch to people in downtown Little Rock. More than 200 freshly grilled hamburger lunches were served to Arkansans, who also received a bag of essential care items including socks, soap, toothbrushes, razors, and other personal hygiene products.

Previously located on the second floor of the First Presbyterian Church, the Stewpot has been an active presence in the Little Rock community since 1972 and has served over 1.5 million meals in that time. Their first meal served 16 people. Today, they average 125 visitors per day. In 2024, they partnered with the Salvation Army and have relocated to the Salvation Army building where they continue their work.

The Stewpot's primary mission is to feed whoever walks through their doors, no questions asked. They are open every weekday providing a hot lunch for anyone in need in the Greater Little Rock area.





## December Foodbank Volunteering

In December, members of the Provider Relations, Compliance, and Marketing and Communications teams volunteered at the Arkansas Foodbank to pack meals for those in need. In just one afternoon, the group packaged over 1,300 bags of cereal to be distributed throughout the state.



## Risk Adjustment Foodbank Volunteers



In April and August, members of the Risk Adjustment team volunteered, preparing items for distribution across the Arkansas Foodbank's vast network of partners.

As longtime supporters of the organization's efforts, we were happy to see a legacy of volunteering with the Arkansas Foodbank continue in 2024.

Since 1984, the Arkansas Foodbank has worked to reduce hunger in Arkansas, connecting people in need with resources and goods. In 2023, the USDA reported that Arkansas had the highest food insecurity rate in the nation at 18.9%. The Arkansas Foodbank is on the frontlines of the fight against food insecurity, serving 33 counties and operating in a network of more than 400 food pantries, schools, colleges, shelters, senior centers, and other agencies.

## Free Dental Clinic Volunteering

On April 12 and 13, Community Relations & Outreach Specialist Cassandra Funes volunteered at the Arkansas Mission of Mercy Dental Clinic, a free clinic providing dental cleanings, fillings, and extractions for those in need. Cassandra provided Spanish language translation services for attendees, helping facilitate care for those who may have limited access to traditional dental settings. This event was open to any child or adult, and there were no eligibility, income, or insurance requirements to participate. Providing these services at no cost removes many barriers to care and gives Arkansans access to care.

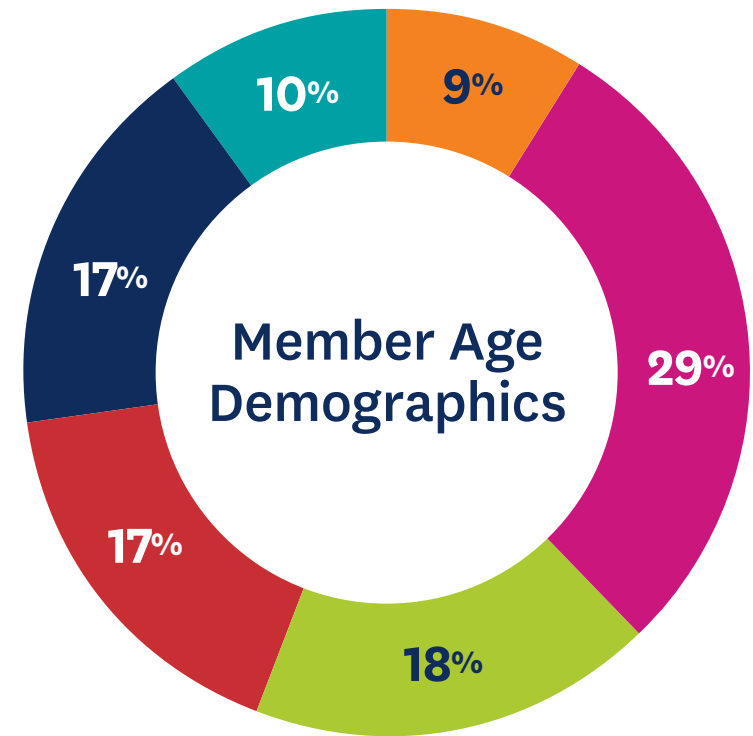
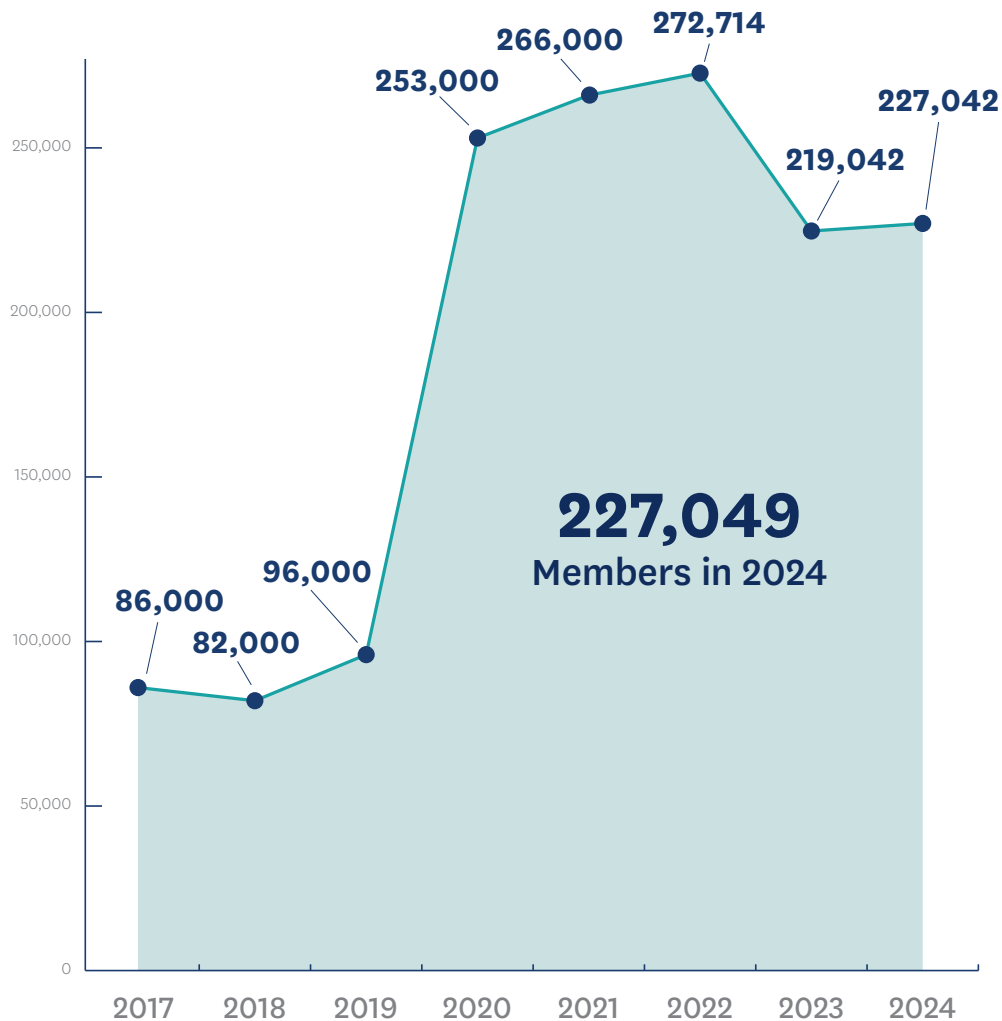
