

Child and Adolescent Well-Care Visits (WCV)



Why it Matters

Well-care visits offer providers the ability to influence patient health and development and are a critical opportunity for screening and counseling. These routine visits also help ensure children are up to date on required vaccinations.¹



Eligible Population

Members 3 to 21 years of age as of Dec. 31 of the measurement year.



Measure Description

The percentage of members 3–21 years of age who had at least one comprehensive well-care visit with a PCP or an OB/GYN practitioner during the measurement year.

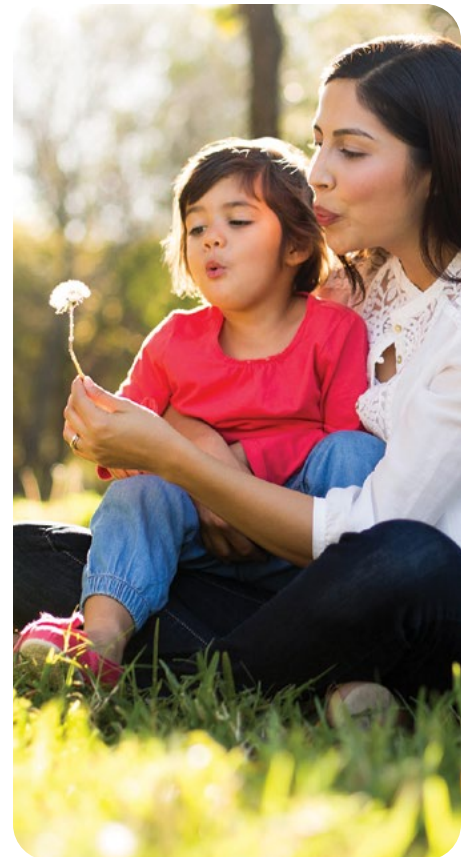

Key Tips



- ✓ Visits must be with a PCP or an OB/GYN practitioner. The practitioner does not have to be the practitioner assigned to the child.
- ✓ Well-care visits can be performed anytime in the measurement/calendar year.
- ✓ As of 2025, telehealth visits are no longer eligible for gap closure.
